



Children grow so quickly, as anyone with little ones knows all too well. Trouser hems can fast become too short, just weeks after they were purchased – but don't despair and throw away those favourite jeans. Save money and get creative by lengthening the hems of trousers with decorative fabric scraps, whilst adding a unique look too.

## sewsupplies

**Fabric: scraps, at least twice as wide as the trouser leg**

**Anchor cotton: a selection of spools in different colours and finishes, for example Alcazar and Metallic**

**Zips: metallic Opti zips, two (optional – select length according to the circumference of the trouser leg)**

**Sewing machine with decorative stitches**

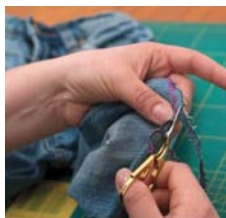
# stitch tips

GET EXTRA WEAR OUT OF THOSE SUMMER SLACKS BY ADDING COLOURFUL PANELS TO TROUSER HEMS



**1 Measure the jeans against your child** to determine how much length needs to be added. Cut strips of fabric, making

sure they are at least as wide as the circumference of each leg hem (this is a great opportunity to use up odds and ends from your stash) – these will be stitched on to give added length. Select which decorative machine stitches you would like to use, and which threads, and plan your design. You can even add Opti Zips between the strips of fabric to create a unique fashionable effect.



**2 Select a compact decorative stitch design** on your machine and with Anchor thread, stitch

along the edge of the fabric to embellish it. Once finished, cut carefully along the stitched edge to neaten, making sure not to snip into the stitch line.

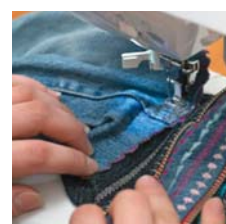


**3 Using a length of strong Coats Cotton,** apply an Opti Zip between each of the fabric strips (don't forget to switch to a zip foot to get a neat

finish when working this step).



**4 Decorate the strips of fabric with your selected design,** adding strips and zips as you go to create the length needed.



**5 Using Coats Cotton,** sew the completed leg extension into a tube (with right sides together), ready to attach to the hem of the

jeans. Place the tube over the bottom of the trouser hem, matching up the side seam with the join of the tube, and using Anchor thread sew the two together using a decorative over stitch.
