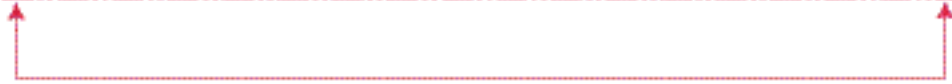

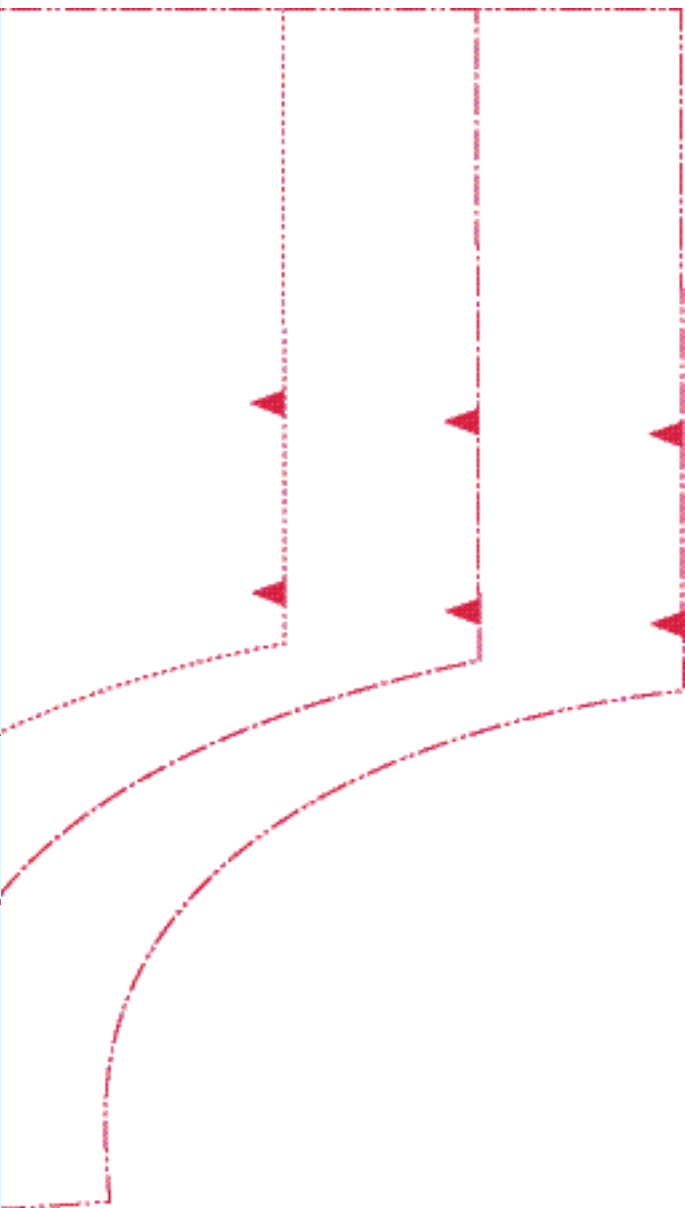
PATTERN INFORMATION

These patterns are full size, so you do not need to enlarge them. A 1/4 in. (1-cm) seam allowance is included but not printed on all the pattern pieces. It is best to copy the patterns onto tracing paper, parchment, or dressmaker's pattern paper and then cut out—that way they can be reused again and again. (Dressmaker's pattern paper or tracing paper is available from sewing stores and online suppliers.) The key (top right) shows which lines you need to follow for the different ages. Each label has a colored background that matches the colored line of the pattern you need to trace. Seam allowances are included where applicable. Check the text for each project, as some measurements may vary. Also, check the pattern labeling carefully for special instructions.

Some of the patterns are shown as halves. When you come to cut out these pieces of fabric, fold the material in half and align the CENTER FOLD LINE on the pattern with the fold in the fabric. Where there are left and right sides to a garment piece—for example, the left and right fronts of a shirt—cut one side, then flip the pattern over before you pin it to the fabric and cut the second side.

PATTERN INFORMATION

These patterns are full size, so you do not need to enlarge them. A $\frac{3}{8}$ -in. (1 -cm) seam allowance is included but not printed on all the pattern pieces. It is best to copy the patterns onto tracing paper, parchment, or dressmaker's pattern paper and then cut out—that way they can be reused again and again. (Dressmaker's pattern paper or tracing paper is available from sewing stores and online suppliers.) The key (top right) shows which lines you need to follow for the different ages. Each label has a colored background that matches the colored line of the pattern you need to trace. Seam allowances are included where applicable; check the text for each project, as some measurements may vary. Also, check the pattern labeling carefully for special instructions.

Some of the patterns are shown as halves. When you come to cut out these pieces of fabric, fold the material in half and align the CENTER FOLD LINE on the pattern with the fold in the fabric. Where there are left and right sides to a garment piece—for example, the left and right front of a shirt—cut one side, then flip the pattern over before you pin it to the fabric and cut the second side.
